

Keep It Simple!!

Here's a simple solution for installing a decent radio and speakers in your bird. Purchase an AM/FM w/ CD player for about \$80. Build a small box of thin door-skin type plywood that has a leg on each side and sits on the transmission hump forward of the shift. Mount the speakers in the rear deck with magnets (easily removable). Use quick disconnect plugs for the speaker wires and get power from the cigarette lighter while utilizing the existing antenna.. If you leave the car unattended you can quickly disconnect the speakers, unplug the cigarette power cord, and disconnect the antennae to facilitate putting the radio in the trunk. To make the car original all you have to do is plug the antenna back into the Town and Country. Make sure to extend the antenna plug so it is easy to get disconnect. You can play the speakers right through the behind the seat drop curtain with minimal distortion.

Another, even easier method, is to find a good boom box that fits behind the seat. Some of them work incredibly well. Then you can have tunes at the T-BIRD roundups without fear of draining your battery.
