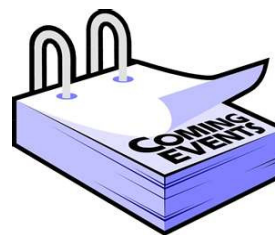
The widower was delighted. He felt his heart skip a beat.

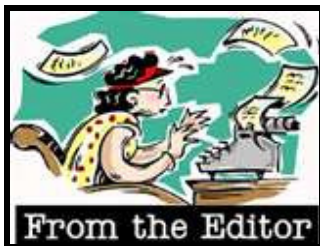
ROWE'S RAMBLINGS
